



PhD Student & Early Career Researcher Travel Awards

HUPO 11th Annual World Congress, Boston, Sept 9-13th, 2012.

Up to five (5) HUPO2010 Association Early Career Travel Awards are available to young Australian and New Zealand proteomics researchers to attend the upcoming HUPO 11th Annual World Congress to be held in Boston, USA from September 9-13th 2012. This initiative is part of a program developed with HUPO's agreement to re-distribute profits from the 9th HUPO World Congress in Sydney back to Australian and New Zealander early career proteomics researchers.

Awardees will be expected to present an oral and/or poster presentation at the HUPO 2012 conference in Boston. Acceptance for oral presentation will be considered more favorably.

These travel awards will cover the cost of a direct return economy class airfare Australia/NZ to Boston and reasonable ground costs incurred by the awardees (accommodation, meals, local transport and conference registration) up to a total value of \$3000AUD.

This application is open to all current Australian or New Zealand PhD students and early postdoctoral career researchers (i.e., awarded their PhD after September 9th 2007) who are working in the area of proteomics. Exceptions to this are where there have been justifiable career breaks for parental leave, family responsibilities, illness, secondment or industry placement - which will be considered appropriately by the selection committee*.

Selection will be based solely on the quality of the submitted abstract, CV (track record relative to opportunity) and related recent submissions and publications. In addition to submitting an HUPO2012 abstract, applicants must provide a brief pdf format 1 page CV summary of track record (incl: fellowships, recent submitted or refereed publications, conference abstracts, prizes and/or awards) and a letter of support from their supervisor/department by closing date COB May 4th, 2012 (*HUPO2012 abstract submission deadline*) emailed to mark.baker@mq.edu.au.

Late applications will not be considered and the results of applications will be notified soon after the HUPO2012 committee determines the scientific program.
